On November 9th, over 30,000 Parkland School District residents weighed in on our Parkland Community LIbrary's referendum question centering on a tax increase. The tax increase, if passed, would have provided enough funds to build and operate a much needed larger facility for you. Our ballot question fell short in support with a difference of less than 3000 votes.

Although the outcome is disappointing to residents who voted yes for our new library, our campaign volunteers and our Parkland Community Library board and staff, it doesn't change the need for our library or how we will serve our community going forward. The Parkland Community Library staff will still help our community connect together, discover and grow while focusing on new ways to create new community partnerships. We will innovate with technology and provide free access to education, arts, and literacy for all.
